

Vision Team Minutes

Feb. 9, 2015

Deacons – We would like to invite a few more interns in order to keep the flock numbers down. This will help the deacons have more time to dedicate to their flock. We also plan to work closely with the discipleship team to help spread God's Word.

Discipleship – We plan to work closely with the Youth Leader once he/she is hired; support the current Sunday School classrooms and the curriculum; we plan to offer 2-3 new Connect Group series throughout the year; continue hosting the Christmas Workshop and participate in the Community VBS.

Finance – An amount of \$4,500 was borrowed from the money market for the month of January.

Mission Action – The WMU is continuing with their meetings as well as the B-Men. Lottie Moon did not reach their mission goal; PORT is coming up (and so far has been a great success!); the pantry still needs donations and these food items are being passed out regularly.

People Support – Three strong candidates were interviewed and one has been scheduled for a second interview with Lynwood for the youth leader position; we are continuing to support Wednesday night suppers with Sue as our faithful church hostess; and the van needs some minor surgeries.

Worship – The Easter Combined Ensemble has been formed and practices are underway.

At Large – The children and youth are doing well and although they are currently assisting with Children's Church, once we have a Part Time Youth Leader, the youth will no longer work with the younger children, but will stay together for Sunday Morning Bible Study.

Pastor's Remarks – The Easter Production is going to be a good experience, and we are going outside of our box, so we all need to participate and pray for a successful event. We are also planning a follow-up Connect Series afterwards.

Vision Team Leaders: We are currently reading <u>Autopsy of a Deceased Church</u>. The author has done extensive research on dying and struggling churches and has led many workshops/seminars to help those churches. We will use part of our team meetings involved in this Book Club discussion.

What We Have To Fear

It was the first camping experience for Jed. As soon as he had pitched his tent, he went for a hike in the woods. In about fifteen minutes he rushed back into camp, bleeding and disheveled.

"What happened?" asked a fellow camper.

"I was chased by a black snake!" cried the frightened Jed.

The camper laughed and retorted, "A black snake isn't deadly."

"Listen," groaned Jed, "If he can make you jump off a fifty-foot cliff, he is!"

There are any number of things in this world that may frighten us. For some of you, it may be snakes, or spiders or rats. For others, it may be great heights or the thought of flying in an airplane. For others, there is a fear of losing your health or losing your job. For most, there is a fear of death.

It was Franklin D. Roosevelt who once said, "The only thing we have to fear is fear itself." I understand him to mean that the way we react to fear is often more dangerous than the thing we fear. Fear can cause us to make rash decisions. At other times, fear can paralyze us so that we do nothing at all.

It is significant to me that the command Jesus gave his disciples more than any other was "Fear not" or "Do not be afraid." The storm is raging. "Fear not!" There are those who seek to do us harm. "Fear not!" The girl has died. "Fear not!" We would regard all of those situations as legitimate reasons to fear. But Jesus made it clear that when He is present, fear is inappropriate. He is capable of handling anything we face, including death!

So what is it that causes you to live in fear? What is it that produces such anxiety that you have trouble going to sleep at night? Turn it over to the One who has promised to watch over you. "Fear not!" Trust Him.

The Psalmist David said, "I sought the LORD, and He heard me, and delivered me from all my fears." (Psalm 34:4)

As Rick Warren often points out, there are 365 specific places in the Bible where we were told by God, "Fear Not" – one for each day of the year!

So whatever you might be facing today, be encouraged by those words and know today is one of those days that God is going to see you though, no matter what!





How to Get Over Your Past

All of us have chapters we wish we could rewrite. To get over your past you must first start looking at it differently. Reframe it. Ask, "How did it make me stronger? What do I know now that I didn't know then?" Don't focus on what you lost, but on what you gained.

Second, understand the difference between guilt and shame. Guilt is feeling bad about what you've done – it's healthy; shame is feeling bad about whom you are – it's toxic and debilitating. All of us have things we'd like to change about ourselves, but when God created us He said, "...it was very


good..." (Gen 1:31), so start seeing yourself as He sees you.

Third, stop punishing yourself with the "if only's." After stumbling badly and having God pick him up, David wrote, "Happy is the person whose sins are forgiven... whom the Lord does not consider guilty..." (Ps 32:1-2) Forgive yourself; God has. Because He sees you through the Cross, you are "accepted" (Eph 1:6).

Finally, move from pain to gain. Healing takes time, so expect some anger, fear and sadness. Don't disown them; they're part of the process. But don't adopt them either; know when it's time to move on. You can't walk backwards into the future, and the future God has in mind contains more happiness than any past you can remember.

Sitting on the Fence

There was an incredibly large group of people assembled. On one side of the group stood a man, Jesus. On the other side of the group stood another man, Satan. Separating them, running through the group was a fence. The scene set, both Jesus and Satan began calling to the people in the group and, one by one, each having made up his or her mind, each went to either Jesus or Satan.





And the man on the fence sat alone. As this man sat there, Satan came back, and appeared to be looking for something that he'd lost. The man said, "Have you lost something?" Satan looked straight at him and replied, "No, there you are. Come with me." "But," said the man, "I sat on the fence. I chose neither you nor Him.

"That's okay," said Satan. "I own the fence."



Life On The Edge

Did you ever come home at 11:30pm for a midnight curfew? It's not likely. As a teenager, I remember waiting on my front steps until 11:59pm before going inside. When given the opportunity, it seems to be in our nature to push the limits to the very farthest degree. How far is too far? How much noise can I make until I push Mom over the edge? How fast over the speed limit can I drive before the police will pull me over? How much can I cheat before getting caught?

We like living on the edge. The problem is that when we do it for too long, we might not realize we're in real danger until it's too late. It's essential that we pay attention to the path we're on. It's like driving on a winding

mountain road: as you near the edge, you'll hit a series of warning grooves that cause you to start bumping along. They are there to remind you to get back on the right track. The Christian life is much the same. I used to think some of the rules in the Bible were cumbersome. I have come to realize, however, that it is these very guidelines – like warning grooves on a road – that help keep me from flying over the edge and losing control in my life.

God's commandments and principles are there for our protection so we can experience all God wants us to experience. Typically, when people lose control of their lives, it isn't just one bad decision that launches them off a moral cliff, but a series of poor choices along the way. The Scriptures, the Holy Spirit, and our brothers and sisters in Christ all provide us with the warning grooves and guardrails we need to prevent us from going over the edge.

The Last Impression

Three elderly gents were talking about what their grandchildren would be saying about them fifty years from now.

"I would like my grandchildren to say, 'He was successful in business,'" declared the first man.

"Fifty years from now," said the second, "I want them to say, 'He was a loyal family man."

"Me?" the third one replied. "I want them to say, 'He certainly looks good for his age.'



There Can Be No Mission Failure!

I forget now where I first heard this comment on many churches today. Yet I have repeated it often in recent years. It simply says: "A church fails when it stops being a 'fisher of men' and starts becoming the 'keeper of an aquarium'."

Jesus told us to go into the entire world and be His ambassadors, but many churches today have inadvertently changed the "go and be" command to a "come and see" approach.

We have grown attached to buildings, programs, staff and a wide variety of goods and services designed to attract and entertain people, and make them comfortable. There is no quicker way to kill a church than to become inward focused.

When the emphasis is on comfort rather than commitment, there is a serious problem. When the overarching concern of the decision

making process is around maintenance (not simply facilities maintenance, but programs and people) then a church loses its very reason for being.

At HBC, we are in the process once again of casting vision for the upcoming year. And the key word is "MISSIONAL!" Every dream we dream, and everything we undertake to accomplish will be measured by this definition.

"Missional" is a term used to describe what happens when you and I replace the "come to us" invitations with a "go to them" life. It's when "the way of Jesus" informs and radically transforms our existence to one wholly focused on sacrificially living for Him and others. It happens when we adopt a missionary stance in relation to our culture.

"Missional" speaks of the very nature of the Jesus follower. As Henry Blackaby has said, "Find out what God is already doing and join him there." We can be certain God is always moving toward people, meeting them right where they are and calling them unto Himself.

Do we have all the material resources we need to accomplish this mission? Not yet. But where there is a God-sized vision for a God-birthed mission, then Spirit anointed people can do supernatural things. The old saying rings true – when God guides, He provides.

The same principle is true on a personal level. When our eyes are turned from inward to upward, from self to others, from temporal to eternal, from carnal to spiritual, the joy of the Lord will be our strength, and He will be our source and our supply.


The Congressman and The Barber

The next morning when the barber came to the shop to open up, there were a dozen Congressmen lined up waiting for a free haircut.


And that, my friends, illustrates the fundamental difference between the citizens of our country and the members of our Congress! – LW


