

Why Sit We Here Until We Die...”

“The armies of Syria had besieged Samaria and the people were dying of starvation. Four lepers, whose disease forced them to live outside the city walls, had got used to living on scraps of bread people threw over the wall each day. But now no more scraps were coming their way. So they said to themselves, ‘Why are we sitting here until we die?’ So they took action. ‘They rose at twilight to go to the camp of the Syrians, to their surprise no one was there. For the Lord had caused the Syrians to hear the noise of a great army. Therefore, they arose and fled and left their tents, their horses, and their donkeys, these lepers went into one tent and ate and drank, and carried from it silver and gold and clothing. Then they said to one another, ‘We are not doing right. This day is a day of good news, and we remain silent, let us go and tell the king’s household’ (2 Kings 7:3-9).

This story teaches us three important truths:

First - Crisis becomes our friend when it moves us to take action. You can call what you choose to do in a crisis a mere act of desperation. Or you can see the situation as simple being at the end of your rope, with no other options to which you can turn. But the truth is, for most of us, the time of real action only occurs when we are “sick and tired of being sick and tired!” It is usually in that moment of honest doubt that our faith begins to rise up, and things begin to change for the better.

Second - Once we take a step of faith, God will move on our behalf. The only thing that can limit God is our doubt, our stubbornness and our complacency. God’s Word says that when Jesus visited his hometown to minister that, *“That He could do no mighty miracles there because of their lack of faith (Matt. 13:58).* Imagine the Messiah, The Son of God, being prevented from doing what He came on missions and wanted to do – heal and deliver. Yet Jesus himself, obeyed the very principles He came to each us – and that is that God delights and demonstrates His power freely. But He chooses only to do so in the atmosphere where people are willing to believe and receive Him and His miraculous works!

Finally, it teaches us that when God blesses us, we can’t keep it to ourselves. Others need what God has given us, and the love of Christ within us should motivate us to get news of the message and the miracle to them on time. Much like the Sea of Galilee as compared to the Dead Sea, our lives stay fresh only when we allow the blessing of God not only to flow into us – But flow through us!

Is there an area of our lives today that we should ask, *“Why Sit We Here Until We Die?”* - The let’s ask the question and respond by rising in faith!

Do We Limit Jesus?

“And he could not do many miracles there because of their lack of faith.” Matt. 15:38

Are their times when we in our limited humanity restrain or frustrate the limitless power of God?

The Bible teaches us on one occasion how Jesus and his miraculous power were rejected when he returned to his hometown of Nazareth. Instead of being received as Messiah and Savior, they received him with suspicion and disbelief.

Many of them instead of believing in him, had many questions and did not believe. *“Where did this man get this wisdom and these mighty works?, Is not this the carpenter’s son? Is not his mother called Mary, and his brothers James and Joseph and Simon and Judas? (Matthew 13:54-55).*

This portion of Scripture gives us a real and very sad picture of what happens when unbelief dominates our lives.

Jesus did not get to do many miracles because of the unbelief in their hearts. He wanted to demonstrate his miraculous power among his own, but could not for lack of faith. How sad a situation is portrayed that Jesus had the desire, the longing, and the wanting to do more miracles, but because of the obstacle of disbelief could not. The people with whom he had grown up, and perhaps been closest to, lost the blessing of all he could and desired to do for them because of their situation.

I wonder how many times we limit God in our lives in some similar way? How many times God wants to do miracles in our midst? But we are the ones who stop the manifestation of His miraculous power!

Today we must determine to not put limits on the miracles that God wants to do in our lives. The thought that there are miracles that God holds in our lives because of the lack of faith or unbelief must cause great uneasiness in us. Losing my miracle because of lack of faith!

Rather than discouraging us, this should cause us to grow in our faith and eagerly anticipate to see the manifestation of God’s miracles in our need.

The world says, *“I will believe it, when I see it!”* The true Christ-follower says, and understands, *“I will see it when I believe it!”* He is a God of miracles, you just have to believe, remember what Mark 9:23 tells us, *“Jesus said, If you can believe, then believes all things are possible.”*



Through Grandpa's Eyes

In "Chicken Soup for the Kid's Soul," Jan Peck shares this story –

"During summer vacations, I would volunteer at the vet's, so I'd seen a lot of dogs. Minnie was by far the funniest-looking dog I'd ever seen. Thin curly hair barely covered her sausage-shaped body. Her bugged-out eyes always seemed surprised. And her tail looked like a rat's tail.

"She was brought to the vet to be put to sleep because her owners didn't want her anymore. I thought Minnie had a sweet personality, though. "No one should judge her by her looks," I thought. So the vet spayed her and gave her the necessary shots. Finally, I advertised Minnie in the local paper: "Funny-looking dog, well behaved, needs loving family."

"When a young man called, I warned him that Minnie was strange looking. The boy on the phone told me that his grandfather's sixteen-year-old dog had just died. They wanted Minnie no matter what. I gave Minnie a good bath and fluffed up what was left of her scraggly hair. Then we waited for them to arrive.

"At last, an old car drove up in front of the vet's. Two kids raced to the door. They scooped Minnie into their arms and rushed her out to their grandfather, who was waiting in the car. I hurried behind them to see his reaction to Minnie.

"Inside the car, the grandfather cradled Minnie in his arms and stroked her soft hair. She licked his face. Her rattail wagged around so quickly that it looked like it might fly off her body. It was love at first lick.

"She's perfect!" the old man exclaimed.

"I was thankful that Minnie had found the good home that she deserved. "That's when I saw that the grandfather's eyes were a milky white color – he was blind."

Wouldn't it be wonderful if we all could look at each other in this same way! All too often, we judge others by the way they look. And, if they don't look or act like our pre-conceived notion of a Christian, then we begin to judge them and reject them.

I am so very glad that the Lord doesn't look at the outward appearance, but looks at the heart. Let's begin to look at all others the way that Jesus looks at them! Then and only then can we begin to truly have a heart for everyone that Jesus died for.



Who Saved Me?

During a terrible storm at sea that threatened every moment to carry the ship to the bottom, one of the ship's crew was doing something on the deck when a great sea struck the ship and went fairly over the deck, striking this man with great force, disabling him and carrying him into the mad waters.

Although he was a good swimmer, he was so disabled that he could only keep above water. They saw him lifting up his imploring hands through the white foam, signifying his desire for help. But the Captain said, "Don't lower a boat, for no small boat can live in this sea, in this terrific storm. We cannot save the man. The most we can do is to save the ship."

The vessel was bearing farther and farther from the helpless man. Once more they saw his imploring hands come up among the white caps further off, which moved all hearts that witnessed it. Still the Captain said a small boat must not be lowered, as it could not live a moment among these wild billows.

But one man who was an expert swimmer, was so moved by the imploring signals of the drowning man, that he threw off his loose garments, saying: "I will save that man, or die with him."

So plunging into the surging deep, he struggled so bravely with the mad waters, that he reached the poor man just as his strength had gone; he had given up and was filling with water, and sinking down unconscious. He grasped him, and strange to tell, he brought him so near the ship that a small boat was lowered, and both men were taken up and laid down upon the deck. The one that had been swept overboard, entirely unconscious and his deliverer nearly so. Appliances were used and both were brought to consciousness.

As soon as the rescued man opened his eyes and found he was not in the ocean, his first words were: "Who saved me?"

He was pointed to his deliverer still lying on the deck in his wet clothes. He crept to his deliverer, and putting his arms around his feet, and in the most tender and heart moving tone of voice cried out: "I'm your servant, I'm your servant." He felt that he could never do enough for him.

Let me ask all who read this incident, would you not put your arms about the bleeding feet of your great Deliverer and say from a full heart:

*"Jesus, I'm your servant, I'm your servant.
Ask anything of me, Jesus, and I will do it the best I can."*

The Joseph Company

Joseph had a vision that his life would be used mightily by God. But that vision seemed like a pipe dream after his jealous brothers sold him into slavery. The following years of Joseph's life were filled with hardship and injustice. Then, when Joseph seemed to get back on his feet, he was falsely accused of attempted rape and sent to prison. Yet, all this time, God was watching over Joseph's life. And finally, after years of turmoil, Joseph ended up serving in Pharaoh's house. Pharaoh eventually

appointed Joseph ruler over all of Egypt.

Beloved, that's how God works; he was preparing a man to save a remnant. Indeed, in every generation, the Lord raises up a Joseph Company. He takes these devoted servants through years of trouble and trials, to prove and strengthen their faith. What does this mean? Scripture says it's what Joseph endured: *"He sent a man before them, even Joseph, who was sold for a servant: whose feet they hurt with fetters: he was laid in iron: until the time that his word came: the word of the Lord tried him"* (Psalm 105:17-19).

The Lord also has a Joseph Company today. These are godly men and women he has touched and called. They don't seek fame or fortune. All they want is to live and die fulfilling the calling God has placed on them. And the Lord promised their lives would count for his kingdom.

Joseph told his brothers, *"God sent me before you to preserve you a posterity in the earth, and to save your lives by a great deliverance. So now it was not you that sent me hither, but God: and he hath made me a father to Pharaoh, and lord of all his house, and a ruler throughout all the land of Egypt"* (Genesis 45:7-8).

Joseph could look back over his years of suffering and testify, "God sent me on this journey. He had a purpose in taking me through all these hardships. I see now that everything I've endured has led up to this moment. Brothers, the Lord has been preparing me to minister to you. He orchestrated all of these things, to bring you under his grace as he did with me." What an incredible revelation for Joseph – and a lesson here for God's people today! Our Lord has preserved us in the past and he will preserve us in the days ahead. And, most important of all, he has an eternal purpose behind it all. He preserved you because he has a purpose for you. And only a tried, tested, proven believer can accomplish it.

This is not a time for timid faith. It's a time when every Christian who has endured great testings must step forward. Our Captain is calling us to stand up amidst a fearful society and engage in "power faith." We're to make the Joseph Declaration: "God sent me before you... to save your lives by a great deliverance" (Genesis 45:7).



Setting GOALS to Reach the Unreached

The United States is now the fourth largest unreached nation on earth. As believers in Christ – one of our greatest priorities is to reach the lost – including the unreached right in our own back yard!

To do this, we need to set **GOALS**. Here is a straightforward five-step planning grid to help you develop an aggressive missions program in the next seven years:

G - Gather the facts—Research: Do your homework. Analyze where you and your church are. Ask lots of questions from key leaders, even if you fear the answers.

O - Organize a plan—Reflect: Develop one-, three-, five- and seven-year schedules, building sequential steps from beginning to end. Add a 30 percent buffer because it will take longer than you expect.

A - Act on the plan—Respond: Once you have your plan in place, take action! Do not wait until every question is answered and funding is completed. Get started!

L - Look back—Review: Life is lived forward and learned backward. As you move forward with your scheduled plan, review your results each quarter, fine-tuning the methods that work and eliminating those that don't.

S - Set new goals—Recommit: Just like climbing a mountain, we have to keep recommitting ourselves to the summit. There are always unexpected turns and unforeseen challenges, but we determine to make it to the top.


