The Blessing Is In The Breaking | Part 1

Why is it that every time we go through a difficulty, our first instinct is to worry and fret? Why is it that I can be so on fire for God one moment...focused and making progress, until a storm arises in my life...and then, almost as if Satan himself were the conductor and I were the orchestra...I shift my focus completely off of what I was doing and place it squarely and completely on the difficulty.

Why do we forget that He is still the God of miracles? Here are a few things I have learned about God in my seasons of doubt and unbelief...

Miracles begin with what you have. Too many focus on what they don't have when the miracle begins with what you have.

When Jesus fed the multitudes, he used certain people that other people say don't count. The women and children weren't counted, but it was a child who had the bread.

The greatest miracles take time. Jesus separated the people into groups and that took time. Sometimes it takes order and structure and management of what you have. You need to get the structure ready for what He is going to give you before you can receive it

You must be thankful for what you have---for what is not enough, before He can give you more than enough. God blesses what you have and what is to come before he multiplies into more than enough. Multiplication will not follow ingratitude.

No one is going through a storm that God is not aware of. You are going through a storm by Divine instruction.

The storm you are going through is the pathway Jesus uses to get to you. In the middle of your storm here comes Jesus walking on the water.

Storms are tests. Always have been. But I have learned that **every test comes AFTER the lesson has been taught.** You already know He is faithful. You already know He has been faithful in every season. The present test is to see if you remember all the times God was with you in your former storms and act accordingly in your present storm. Tell your present about your past!

For The Love Of Jesus...

God's love for you is literally everywhere. And the most important thing is God's love for you is unconditional.

That's different than human love. Human love wears out. Human love doesn't always work out. We know that. We try to put fractured families back together. There are a lot of broken relationships around us,

because human love wears out. But God's love never wears out.

There is no condition where God will ever stop loving you. That's called unconditional love.

"Nothing in all creation is able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus." Nothing can separate you from God's love. You can't make God stop loving you. You can try. But you will fail. Because God's love isn't based on who you are. It's based on who He is.

It's also not based on what you do. It's not based on your performance. God isn't waiting for you to be nice and act right for Him to love you because love is based on who He is. He loves you on your bad days; He loves you on your good days. He loves you when you feel it; He loves you when you don't feel it.

In fact, long before God even created the universe, God wanted to say this to you: *"You matter to me. I love you. I have always loved you. I loved you before you were born. I thought you up. I created you. I saw you take your first breath. I saw you formed in your mother's womb. I've seen the good, the bad and the ugly in your life and I've never stopped loving you because my love for you is unconditional."*

Another great thing about God's love is that, if you tap into it, it's sufficient to handle any problem in your life. It's multi-dimensional. The Bible says *"May you be able to feel and understand how long, how wide, how deep and how high God's love really is and experience this love for yourselves."*

Notice God says I don't want you to just know that I love you. I want you to experience it. If you go "Oh yeah, I know God loves me, big deal, so what?," then you've never experienced it. Because when you experience the unconditional, eternal, lavish outrageous love of God it changes your life. You may have head knowledge but you don't have heart knowledge of it. He says I want you to experience the love of God.

That is my prayer for you. I want you to know how wide and long and high and deep is God's love. Long enough to last forever. Wide enough to be everywhere you're going to be. Deep enough to handle any problem.

Should I Go to Church?

I was confident that nowhere in the Bible did it say I should go to church. But then I read Ephesians 4:11-13:

"It was he who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers, to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ." Then I wondered: If Christ gave pastors and teachers to prepare me for works of service, shouldn't I use them?



Then I read Hebrews 10:24-25: *"And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds. Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another – and all the more as you see the Day approaching."* And I realized that being together with other Christians is how God intends to encourage me to do what is right.

Then I read Romans 10:13b-17: *"... 'Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.' How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? And how can they preach unless they are sent? As it is written, 'How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!' But not all the Israelites accepted the good news. For Isaiah says, 'Lord, who has believed our message?' Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word of Christ."* And I knew that Jesus sent these pastors and teachers to build my faith.

Then I read Matthew 16:18: *"And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it."* And I discovered that Jesus built the church, owns it, and protects it.

Then I read Matthew 18:20: *"For where two or three come together in my name, there am I with them."* And I found that when His followers gather to worship Him, He joins them.

Then I read Luke 4:16a: *"He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath day he went into the synagogue, as was his custom."* And I discovered that Jesus himself was in the habit of attending church.

The last reason was perhaps the best reason of all. If Jesus thought it was important, why shouldn't I? I wonder why some other believers in our church don't feel the same?



The Dog Days of Summer

Everyone knows that the “dog days of summer” occur during the hottest and muggiest part of the season. Webster defines “dog days” as...1: *the period between late July and early September when the hot sultry weather of summer usually occurs in the northern hemisphere* / 2: *a period of stagnation or inactivity*

Let's not let August become a “Dog Days” for our church with stagnation or inactivity in our giving. In today's struggling economy for everyone in our church family, young and old alike, simply making ends meet can be our greatest challenge. The same need is faced by HBC as a ministry.
