Thanksgiving Day Service 10am on Thanksgiving Day

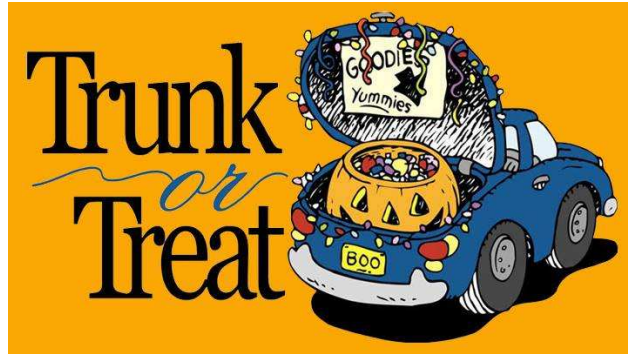


All the area churches will be joining us on Thanksgiving Day for our Thanksgiving Service.

“It’s Time For Your Comeback!”

And he said unto Abram, Know of a surety that thy seed shall be a stranger in a land that is not theirs, and shall serve them; and they shall afflict them four hundred years; And also that nation, whom they shall serve, will I judge: and afterward shall they come out with great substance. And thou shalt go to thy fathers in peace; thou shalt be buried in a good old age. —Genesis 15:13-15

Do you believe that God’s word can change the atmosphere of your life? It can. It will. I believe this passage speaks to us in a significant way. I want to talk about God planning your comeback. In scripture, God gave Abraham two promises:

Promise #1 – That he would die at a ripe old age. Question: Do you ever worry about dying? Do you believe your life is fully in the hands of God?

God came to Abraham and He basically said, “Abraham, I don’t want you to worry about dying. You will go to the grave at a good old age.” I believe this means we ought to just expect and claim that we’ll have good memories and we’ll have healthy, strong bodies. I know we get older and everything changes, for sure. But I’m claiming today the good old age. I’ll always have provision. I’ll always be taken care of, because man is not my source. Isn’t that good news? That’s good news. Be free from the fear of what’s coming. Good is what’s coming.

Promise #2 - That his wayward children would comeback. Questions: Do you have children you worry about or who are not walking with God today? Can you have faith for a “comeback” for your child?

God warned Abraham about this, but in the covenant that He made with him, He told him that his children would come back again to where He called them to be. There will be a comeback.

This truth is for your children, but it is also for you. No matter how pessimistic, no matter how negative it looks today, you’re going to come back. It’s a season of comeback. It’s time to get up off the mat if you’ve been knocked down. If you’ve been through something, if you’ve been through financial setback or some kind of terrible thing has hit you in your health or something’s happened to your family, it’s time for a comeback!

It’s not time to quit. It’s no time to give up. It’s not time to moan and groan. We may be down, but we’re not out, because we serve a comeback God. Sometimes in life, stuff just happens. You may feel like you’ve been through hell, you messed up, and you did something you shouldn’t have done. It’s time for a comeback. The Bible said there is a river whose streams shall make glad again. That’s the river of the Holy Spirit, and if you can get a scent of that river, God can orchestrate your comeback!

Give Me Your Last Meal

"I am gathering a few sticks to take home and make a meal for myself and my son, that we may eat it, and die"
– 1 Kings 17:12

Imagine telling a widow who was about to eat her last meal with her only son to give you a portion of that meal. That would seem like a cruel and selfish thing to do. Imagine you have a need for provision and God tells you to go to the most desperate person in the land to get your provision.

God led Elijah to a poor widow who was on her last meal of flour. Why would God lead Elijah from one desperate situation into another? He wished to perform yet another miracle and show His faithfulness to those who needed it most. Elijah proceeded to tell the widow: *"But first make a small cake of bread for me from what you have and bring it to me, and then make something for yourself and your son. For this is what the LORD, the God of Israel, says: 'The jar of flour will not be used up and the jug of oil will not run dry until the day the LORD gives rain on the land'"* (1 Kings 17:13-14).

Would you have questioned such logic in the face of a life-threatening situation? The woman demonstrates her faith in God and Elijah by giving him her last meal. This act of faith insured that her provision would be there day after day. God multiplied her flour and her jug of oil. Provision followed obedience. *"For the jar of flour was not used up and the jug of oil did not run dry..."* (1 Kings 17:16).

God often multiplies what we already have in our hand in a miraculous way when we yield it to Him. God took her only resource just like He took the loaves and fishes, and multiplied it for those who were in need. God has placed skills and resources in our hand already. We need to apply faith to that which He has placed in our hand in order to see His provision manifested through them.



Is It A Church or A Building?

Did you know that the Bible never refers to a building in which God's people meet as a church?

The name, "church," always refers to the gathering of people in the Bible. There were absolutely no denominational separations, divisions or labels. They were simply known as "the church" and the location of where they gathered – for example, the church at Rome or the church at Ephesus.

When Paul and Barnabas came to Antioch and wanted the meet with the believers there, the Bible says that *"when they were come, and had gathered the church together, they rehearsed all that God had done with them"*(Acts 14:27).

The church had to be gathered together for a meeting. The church itself was comprised of and identified as the people. There were no divisions or denominational identities or affiliations. They were simply a group of people, small or large, called to represent Jesus to everyone around them.

This is in part why your faithful attendance to church today is so important. It is a demonstration of your love for and obedience to God. It is also a witness and encouragement to others around you

A couple of centuries ago, certain groups like the early Baptists did not call their buildings churches. They were called meeting houses. They used this terminology on purpose because they knew that the church was the people.

Perhaps, if we were honest with ourselves, we could learn from them today!



You Want To Be In God's Will...Is He In Yours?

God Word commands us, *"Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust does corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where*

neither moth nor rust does corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal: For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also" (Matt. 6:19-21).

By planning ahead in writing your will and choosing to leave part of your estate to the ongoing work of God's Church, you can continue to fulfill God's purpose even after your death. Sometimes I like to ask, *"You want to be in God's will... Shouldn't He be in yours?"*

Your Last Will and Testament can stand as a final act of good stewardship. Oftentimes a designation of the tithe, or simply one-tenth of your estate will far exceed beyond many tithes and offerings given at their present value. When we specify a portion of our inheritance to God first, we honor not only Him but our family and friends as well.

God Himself has told us that everything belongs to Him: *"The earth is the LORD'S, and the fullness thereof; the world, and they that dwell therein"* (Psa. 24:1). As good stewards, we must seek God's will in deciding what we do with His gifts. We know that God accomplishes His purpose through those who seek to do His will, and that He *has "put in [our] hearts to fulfill His will"* even after we are gone! (Rev. 17:17).
