God always provides!



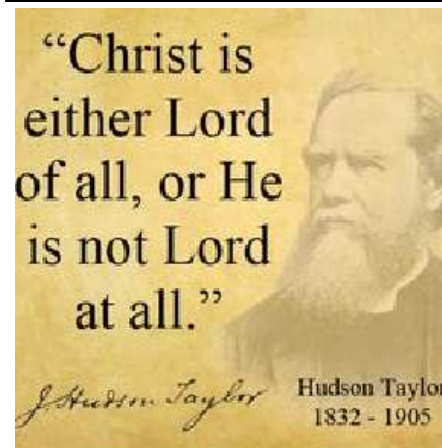

When Your Bad Becomes Unbearable

Every day, life happens! You've been there. I've been there. Everyone has experienced some level of frustration and pain in the daily experiences of life. No one is immune to these realities.

So, "What do you do when Bad Times turn into Unbearable Times?" The answer to that question eludes us all too often. The reality is that we have all made the naïve and foolish statement, "Can things get any worse?"

If you have ever uttered such sentiments, you are in good company. The children of Israel made the same declaration. Pharaoh got wind that God's people wanted to leave for a few days to dedicate to worship. That sounded like a reasonable request, but the outcome produced more hurt and difficulty for the children of God than they had ever known.

Pharaoh responded with the order... "Don't give the slaves any more straw to put in their bricks..." Exodus 5:7. In an instant, an already bad situation now becomes unbearable!

I am sure you can identify with the Hebrew people in this timeless story. Bad yesterday! Today unbearable! What a great place to find oneself. What happens next is what the Lord told Moses:

"Soon you will see what I will do to the king. Because of my mighty power, he will let my people go, and he will even chase them out of his country." Exodus 6:1.

When we become desperate, we cry out in desperation, which is an entirely different kind of prayer. Desperate cries for help create divine deliverance. God heard the cries of the Slaves and moved on their behalf. He will for your circumstances as well. The next time you find yourself in a desperate and 'unbearable' situation, consider the following:

Relax – Psalms 116:7 - Now I can relax. For the Lord has done this wonderful miracle for me.

Cast – 1 Peter 5:7 - Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you.

Rest – Psalms 62:5 - The fear of the Lord leads to life; then one rests content, untouched by trouble.

These three words: Relax, Cast, and Rest describe productive actions you can take when life goes sideways. *Relax* – God is working things out for your good in spite of what you see happening around you. *Cast* – Like casting a fishing pole far from the bank, God wants you to cast your troubles far from the bank of your soul. *Rest* – Resting content, untouched by troubles is available to you in the midst of the unbearable times!

Are You In God's Will...Is He In Yours?



God Word commands us, "*Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust does corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust does corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal: For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also*" (Matt. 6:19-21).

By planning ahead in writing your will and choosing to leave part of your estate to the ongoing work of God's Church, you can continue to fulfill God's purpose even after your death. Sometimes I like to ask, "You want to be in God's will... Shouldn't He be in yours?"

Your Last Will and Testament can stand as a final act of good stewardship. Oftentimes a designation of the tithe, or simply one-tenth of your estate will far exceed beyond many tithes and offerings given at their present value. When we specify a portion of our inheritance to God first, we honor not only Him but our family and friends as well.

God Himself has told us that everything belongs to Him: "*The earth is the LORD'S, and the fullness thereof; the world, and they that dwell therein*" (Psa. 24:1). As good stewards, we must seek God's will in deciding what we do with His gifts. We know that God accomplishes His purpose through those who seek to do His will, and that He *has "has put in [our] hearts to fulfill His will"* even after we are gone! (Rev. 17:17).
