“Revelation – The Seven Churches”

The seven churches of Revelation were real, physical congregations when the Apostle John wrote this bewildering last book of the Bible around 95 A.D., but scholars believe and agree the passages have a second, more eternal meaning of the church through the ages.

The short letters are addressed to these specific seven churches of Revelation. They disclose the description of the spiritual health conditions of each church:

Ephesus had "abandoned the love it had at first," (Revelation 2:4, ESV). They lost their love for Christ, which in turn affected the love they had for others.

Smyrna was warned it was about to face persecution. Jesus encouraged them to be faithful unto death and he would give them the crown of life—eternal life.

Pergamum was told to repent. It had fallen prey to a cult called the Nicolaitans, heretics who taught that since their bodies were evil, only what they did with their spirit counted. This led to sexual immorality and eating food sacrificed to idols. Jesus said those who conquered such temptations would receive "hidden manna" and a "white stone," symbols of special blessings.

Thyatira had a false prophetess who was leading people astray. Jesus promised to give himself (the morning star) to those who resisted her evil ways.

Sardis had the reputation of being dead, or asleep. Jesus told them to wake up and repent. Those who did would receive white garments, have their name listed in the book of life, and would be proclaimed before God the Father.

Philadelphia endured patiently. Jesus pledged to stand with them in future trials, granting special honors in heaven, the New Jerusalem.

Laodicea had lukewarm faith. Its members had grown complacent because of the riches of the city. To those who returned to their former zeal, Jesus vowed to share his ruling authority.

Even though John wrote these warnings nearly 2,000 years ago, they still apply to Christian churches today. Christ remains the head of the worldwide Church, lovingly overseeing it.

As in ancient times, the temptation to embrace alternatives to true commitment and following Jesus and backsliding continues to be a danger for people who believe in Jesus Christ. But reading these short letters to the seven churches serves as a reminder. In a world and society flooded with temptation, they bring the Christian back to the First Commandment. Only the True God is worthy of our worship!

Allow The Holy Spirit To Live Through You

You can work, work, work at being more Christ-like every day. But you will fail. You cannot do it. God did not design you in that way, and nor can you develop that capacity.

It is the Holy Spirit's job to produce Christ-like character in you. In a mystical mirror image, He is the invisible and powerful transforming image of everything Christ is.

No one knows Jesus better than the Father and the Holy Spirit. The Father reserved His place to rule and reign the universe from Heaven. When Jesus completed His earthly ministry, He ascended back to the Father to sit in the throne room and to make intercession on our behalf for every prayer and supplication we make to God.

But as the Father was delighted to send the Holy Spirit to anoint Jesus for His earthly ministry, He now delights in sending Him upon us. He directs us according to Father's perfect plan and purposes. He empowers us to be conformed to the image of Jesus Christ. He delights when we allow His divinity to flow through and outshine our carnal fleshly natural man.

You and I cannot reproduce the character of Jesus on our own strength. Resolutions, willpower, and best intentions are not enough. Only the Holy Spirit has the power to make the changes God wants to make in our lives. The Bible says, *"God is working in you, giving you the desire and the power to do what pleases him"* (Philippians 2:13 NLT).

Mention *"the power of the Holy Spirit,"* and many people think of miraculous demonstrations and intense emotions. But, most of the time, the Holy Spirit's power is released in your life in quiet, unassuming ways that you aren't even aware of or feel. Remember the Holy Spirit is a divine person of the trinity. He more than merely an invisible power.

In other words, Christ-likeness is not produced by imitation but by inhabitation. We allow the Holy Spirit to live and produce the life of Christ through us.

How does this happen? Through the choices we make. We surrender access to our lives and wills by choosing to follow Jesus in all situations and then trust God's Spirit to give us his power, love, faith, and wisdom to do it. Since God's Spirit lives inside of us, these things are always available for the asking.

Why not allow Him to live through your life more completely today? His presence is with us and is waiting to be invited in!

How Much Can God Trust You With?

We never really own anything – it's just a loan. It was God's property before we arrived, and He'll lend it to somebody else after we're gone. Our selfish culture says, "If I don't own it, why should I take care of it?" Those who understand God's will live by a higher standard. They say, "Because God owns it, I'll take even better care of it!" In God's Kingdom, "...those who are trusted with something valuable must show they are worthy of that trust." (1 Cor. 4:2)



To illustrate this, Jesus told the story of a businessman who entrusted his wealth to his servants while he was away. When he returned he evaluated and rewarded them accordingly: "Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness!" (Matt. 25:21)

When you make the most of what God has given to you He promises three rewards. First, you'll be given commendation: "Well done, good and faithful servant!" Next, you'll receive promotion: "I will put you in charge of many things." Finally, you'll be honored with a celebration: "Come and share your master's happiness."

For many of us, money is the greatest test of all. Jesus addresses this: "If you are untrustworthy about worldly wealth, who will trust you with the true riches of Heaven?" (Luke 16:11) There's a direct correlation between how you use your money, and the quality of your life. So the question is, could the way you're handling your money be preventing God from blessing you with more?


