“Revelation – The Panoramic Picture!”

What does Revelation mean? What is Revelation about? It’s very confusing. It’s compelling, it’s full of symbolism. And here’s what I love about the book of Revelation. Basically the book of Revelation has one message. We win!

So I’m not going to teach this series to scare you. I’m not going to do this series just to inform you. I pray that this series conforms you into the image of Christ. What can happen is we can get so caught up in the book of Revelation, about the who and the why and the when, that we miss the “do” part.

In other words, here's the book of Revelation. Here’s the end times. How does it affect me where I live today? That’s the most important thing. We are going to get into some of the unique stuff, some of the symbolism, and some of the futuristic things that I believe will cause us to go wow! Because the book of Revelation means” the reveal.” The interesting about the reveal is that Jesus is the one doing the revealing!

John wrote the book of Revelation. John was one of the 12 disciples, one of Christ’s inner group of friends. He was exiled to the isle of Patmos because he was preaching the gospel and the Romans didn’t like it. As it turned out, John was more effective for God on Patmos than he was when he was on the streets preaching because of what he heard and saw from God and was able to write it down and record it for future generations.

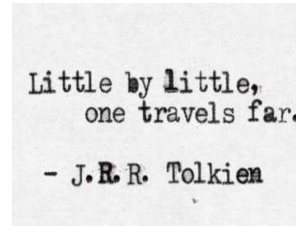
The specifics of John’s vision pertained to the seven major churches of his day, and the letter of “Revelation” was circulated in a clockwise fashion and read as sermons to each and all these churches. So that’s how it was dispersed, and ultimately it was directed to Christians worldwide.

The Book of Revelation begins with a profound declaration beyond anything else we see is scripture. In Revelation 1:1-2, we read as follows: *“The Revelation (in other words, the full identity) from Jesus Christ, which God gave him to show his servant what must soon take place.”*

We’ve got to realize when it comes to God, the time is always “now” from God’s perspective. Remember, He identified Himself to Moses as the great *“I am, that I am.”* Once these events and things spoken of by John start happening, once the dominos start falling, it’s going to be quick. Here’s what “soon” will take place.

Is this a time to fear and dread as we witness the final unfolding chapter in the story of human history? Absolutely not! If anything, it is a time of rejoicing, anticipation and hope in that our final redemption draws near, and Jesus is about to return in power for His bride, the Church. It is a time of celebration... So let the rejoicing begin!

“Little By Little...”

The Lord your God will drive those nations out ahead of you little by little. You will not clear them away all at once... Deuteronomy 7:22

Although God could instantly transform us, he has chosen to develop us slowly. Jesus is deliberate in developing his disciples.

Just as God allowed the Israelites to take over the Promised Land "little by little," so they wouldn't be overwhelmed, he prefers to work in incremental steps in our lives.

Why does it take so long to change and grow up? There are several reasons.

"There is no growth without change; there is no change without fear or loss; and there is no loss without pain."

We are slow learners. - We often have to relearn a lesson forty or fifty times to really get it. The problems keep recurring, and we think, "Not again! I've already learned that!"—but God knows better. The history of Israel illustrates how quickly we forget the lessons God teaches us and how soon we revert to our old patterns of behavior. We need repeated exposure.

We have a lot to unlearn. - Many people go to a counselor with a personal or relational problem that took years to develop and say, "I need you to fix me. I've got an hour." They naïvely expect a quick solution to a long-standing, deep-rooted difficulty. Since most of our problems—and all of our bad habits—didn't develop overnight, it's unrealistic to expect them go away immediately.

Our spiritual growth is directly proportionate to crucifying of our old nature, habits and selfishness of the life we lived before we knew Christ.

There is no pill, prayer, or principle that will instantly undo the damage of many years. It requires the hard work of removal and replacement. The Bible calls it "taking off the old self" and "putting on the new self." (Romans 13:12; Ephesians 4:22-25; Colossians 3:7-10, 14.)

Growth is often painful and scary. There is no growth without change; there is no change without fear or loss; and there is no loss without pain. We fear these losses, even if our old ways were self-defeating, because, like a worn out pair of shoes, they were at least comfortable and familiar.

Every change involves a loss of some kind: You must let go of old ways in order to experience the new. By God’s grace – you can!

Wonder and Worship

Never lose your sense of wonder, or you'll lose your motivation for worship. Unless you believe God is all-powerful, ever-present and approachable, you'll live in a state of anxiety believing that everything depends on you. You'll shrink from sharing your faith in case you're ridiculed or can't find the right words. You'll fail to be generous because the source of your security is in yourself. You'll avoid confronting those who need it, because without the certainty of God's acceptance you become a slave to people's opinions.



We live in a cynical age that discourages wonder. We've diminished the marvel and awe, yet deep down we still ache for it. When you shrink your concept of God to fit your own rationale, you pray without faith, work without passion, serve without joy, and suffer without hope. And the result is fear, retreat and loss of vision.

But there's one thing that's guaranteed to restore your understanding of how big and wonderful God is – worship. God created us so that when we experience something awe-inspiring we need to praise it, to wrap words around it. We don't worship God because He needs it, but because we do.

Without worship our perception of Him is incomplete; we forget how great He is; we overlook our calling and become self-involved. We lose our sense of wonder and gratitude by plodding through life with blinkers on, and we become self-reliant, stubborn and proud. So, each day let us pause and say, "Exalt the Lord our God, and worship at His footstool..." (Psalm 99:5)
