



“Confidence On Judgement Day”

“In this way, love is made complete among us so that we will have confidence on the day of judgment, because in this world we are like him.”

1 John 4:17

I doubt if there is a single person who does not realize, deep in his or her heart, that at the end of life there is an accounting. We must stand before the Lord our Maker. It does not make any difference whether we are Christians or non-Christians. Regardless of the type of relationship we have with Him, we must all come face to face with the Lord Himself. He stands at the end of every path we may be taking today, and we must come at last to a day of accounting.

We cannot help but ask ourselves how we will do in that day. Can I pass that unconscious test that Jesus speaks of in Matthew 25, when He stands to judge the nations and divides the sheep on His right hand, the goats on His left? He will say to the people on his right, Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world (Matthew 25:34). Why? For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me (Matthew 25:36). Do you remember their reaction? Lord, when did this happen? We weren't aware of it. We don't remember seeing You; we don't remember doing these things.

Then He says to those on his left, Depart into everlasting judgment. Why? Because when you saw Me weak and sick and in prison, you did nothing about it. You passed on your way, you showed no concern, you displayed no compassion, you did nothing. Again, remember that they say with surprise, Why, Lord, when did this happen? We don't have any memory of it. If we had seen you, we'd have done something, but we don't even remember seeing you (cf. Matthew 25:41-44). The searching revelation of that passage is that this is now happening all about us. Christ is in all these situations of need, and when we are confronted with someone who has a need, it is Jesus who is asking our help. Our reaction to that person is our reaction to Him.

Therefore, is there not a question in each heart now: When I stand before Him like that, will I pass the test? Do I recognize these situations now? John says it is love perfected that gives us confidence in the day of judgment. Love that is perfected is love made visible in deeds. Therefore, note what John is saying: If you want to have confidence in the day of judgment, then let love express itself, let it be perfected, because it is when love is perfected with us that we have confidence for the day of judgment.

Almost...

You know, there is probably nothing more consistent about life than its inconsistencies.

The world says: "Life is like a tossed salad. You stick in your fork & you never know for sure what you're going to get." The world says: "Life is like a roller coaster with its ups & downs & twists & turns, & you never really know what will happen next."

But if there is one very strong message that comes to us from Calvary, it is that God is able to take all the inconsistencies, all the fragments & pieces of our life & weave them together into a beautiful tapestry, just as He planned.

And that is a message we need to hear. Because one day the sun shines, & the next it rains. One day we think everything is going our way, & the next our world comes crashing down around us. One moment we're young & healthy, & the next the doctor tells us that he has some bad news for us.

Yet, Jesus is saying, "It really doesn't matter because all of you who have really committed yourselves to Me will find righteousness, & goodness, & victory, not defeat. You'll find that your despair is replaced with eternal hope, because that is the message of Calvary."

So in the light of all that, our prayer ought always to be, *"O God, almighty God, help us never, ever to look at the cross & see the One who died there without feeling the touch of a tear on our cheek, without feeling our hearts strangely moved & broken. Let us never come there, Lord, & just casually look at it, & almost be moved by it. But then turn away from it & go on with life as usual."*

You see, the ultimate tragedy is that in almost every worship service, there are often people who need to, and are almost ready to make a decision. There are people who stand right on the brink of saying, "I surrender all. I'm going to follow Jesus." And they almost do it.

Others are just like those soldiers casting dice at the feet of Jesus. They're so engrossed in what they're doing that they never look up & let the message sink in & make a change in their lives. They're near & yet so far.

Our goal should always be that we offer the invitation of Jesus, praying that if you're almost there, you won't turn away. It is the invitation of our Savior & our Lord. I really don't know how anybody can say "No" to Him. But some do. I pray that you will not, that you will answer "Yes," a new and refreshed commitment to Christ!



Passionate About God's Will

"So we continued the work... from the first light of dawn till the stars came out." - Nehemiah 4:21

In the face of overwhelming odds, Nehemiah rebuilt the walls of Jerusalem in just 52 days. How? Because of a single-minded passion to do so. Some of us are afraid to pray 'Lord, I'll do what you want me to do,' in case He sends us somewhere we don't want to go or asks us to do something we don't feel ready or qualified to do. You've got it wrong! The Bible says God's will is "good, and acceptable, and perfect" (Romans 12:2). What is there to be afraid of in that formula?

Now, while God's will for us is 'good', it's not necessarily easy. But He gives us a passion for it. Jeremiah said that when he tried to stop speaking about the Lord, God's Word became "like a burning fire shut up in my bones" (Jeremiah 20:9 NAS). You can't contain a fire that God lights. When He sets your heart ablaze, you begin to see things you never saw before and get excited about them. He can even take your chapters of regret and write a story of grace.

But it's not likely you'll experience much of a passion for anything if you're just sitting on the sidelines waiting for something to happen. James says "Don't just be a hearer of God's word, be a doer" (James 1:22). You'll get a passion for God's will once you begin doing it! You'll think 'this is what I was made for'. And when you have a compelling reason for doing something and know that God is watching and smiling on you, it makes all the difference.

The Last Impression...

There was a woman who spent some months serving at a religious mission in Kenya. On her final visit to a remote township she attended a medical clinic. As the Maasai women there began to sing together, she found herself deeply moved by their hauntingly beautiful harmonies.



She wanted to always remember so she recorded this moment and would share it with friends when she arrived home. With tears flowing down her cheeks, she turned to her friend and asked, "Can you please tell me the translation of the words to this song?"

Her friend looked at her and solemnly replied, "If you boil the water, you won't get dysentery."


The reality is that the hope of the world is the message of Jesus through the local church. *And you have a place in that!* You are invited to be a part of the greatest movement in the history of the world.
