## *“Timeline Of The End Times”*

To understand the end time prophecies, it’s helpful to look at the book of Daniel and the book of Revelation together. For example, because of Daniel’s writings, we know that the tribulation period (which is the period of time just before Christ returns to the earth) will be exactly seven years.

*“He will confirm a covenant with many for one ‘seven.’ In the middle of the ‘seven’ he will put an end to sacrifice and offering. And at the temple he will set up an abomination*

*that causes desolation, until the end that is decreed is poured out on him.”*

*Daniel 9:27*

Daniel’s prophecy tells us that the Antichrist will confirm a covenant (peace agreement) with many nations that will be effective for a period of one seven. By connecting this verse to other scripture in the Bible, we know that this is referring to a period of seven years. I’ll go into detail about how we know that in this Sunday’s message.

The focus of the peace agreement will be Israel. When we see this peace agreement take place, we will know that the countdown of the final seven years, known as the tribulation, has begun.

If you remember nothing else from this message, remember that this peace agreement is the single event that starts the seven-year countdown to Christ’s return to the earth.

By knowing that the rise of the Anti-Christ and the abomination of desolation will occur exactly halfway through the tribulation, and also knowing that the last half of the tribulation is 3 ½ years in length, we know that the period of time referenced in Daniel 9:27 is seven years.

Here are the key things to remember:

The tribulation will last for seven years and begins when the Antichrist confirms a covenant (peace agreement) with many nations.

In the middle of the seven years, the Antichrist will set up an abomination that desecrates the temple in Jerusalem and he will put an end to animal sacrifices.

The Lord will return to the earth (Matthew 24:29–30).

Our hope is that the rapture of the church will happen before we see these events so that we don’t have to suffer the tribulation. However, if we are called to endure, then we can also know that our God will provide protection and grace. My personal goal is to be ready whenever the Lord decides to come and I hope that will be your goal too!

## *The Way to Pray*

There is a story I once heard about three pastors who were standing outside one day, discussing the best positions for prayer, while a telephone repairman worked nearby. "Kneeling is definitely the best way to pray," the one pastor said.

"No," said the next minister. "I get the best results standing with my hands outstretched to Heaven."

"You're both wrong," the oldest pastor said. "The most effective prayer position is lying down on the floor."

The repairman could contain himself no longer. "Hey, fellas," he interrupted. "The best prayin' I ever did was when I was hangin' upside down from a telephone pole!"

I think that the repairman was probably the closest to the truth! But, perhaps if you were in prison, rather than hanging from a telephone pole, you may have an even better understanding of just how to pray! In fact, that is exactly what we see in Acts 4.

Peter and John were put in prison for preaching about Jesus. After they were released from the prison, they head back to the church, where they all begin to pray. And, their prayer, as recorded in Acts 4:23-30, provides a fantastic understanding of the best way to pray!



## **Generous And Compassionate**

*“I command you, You shall open wide your hand to your brother, to the needy and to the poor, in your land.” Deuteronomy 15:11*

As His people approached the Promised Land, God repeatedly declared His desire to bless them. He assured them He would provide for their every need. He warned that they would face enemies but promised to defeat them.

When God gave His commandments, He did so for the good and benefit of His people. As long as they obeyed His principles, He would cause them to be in health and to prosper. But beyond the promise of individual blessing there was another side to these promises.

While His people could now look forward to receiving His blessings, they were also now encouraged to practice giving, and not just receive for themselves. They were to remember to be sensitive to the needs of others.

The people of the covenant were now specifically being called to be known as a people of compassion, looking for ways to help. And they were to be generous about using the resources they were given. They needed to realize that He was going to bless them specifically so that that they might be a blessing to others.

Demonstrating the same principle, Jesus continually was concerned about meeting needs. Everywhere we see Him in the gospels, we see Him being motivated by compassion. He provided for the crowds, as He taught them and healed their sick (Matthew 9:36, Matthew 15:32). He reminded His disciples that just as they had freely received; they were to freely give (Matthew 10:8).

God knows that this is contrary to our human nature. We all recognize that some people are hoarders. Others are stingy, holding on to the things they have been given, reluctant to share.

But the Bible teaches us the importance of being compassionate. Being motivated by mercy. As Moses directed Israel, they were to be people who cared, and showed kindness.

This same principle applies to us. We are to look around, always sensitive to needs. Then as God directs, we are to open our hand, and help others in whatever ways we can.

In your life, look for opportunities to be a blessing. Realize that God has blessed you that you might be a blessing to others. Be an ambassador of His love.



## **The Magic 8-Ball**

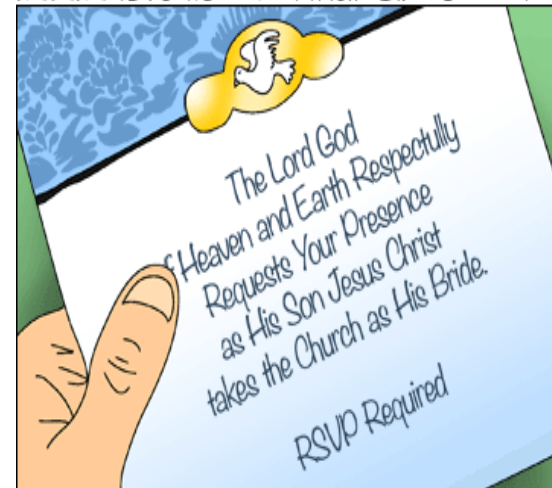
When I was a young boy, I remember a special toy I used to have – the “Magic 8-Ball.” In case you aren’t familiar with this iconic toy, allow me to refresh your memory. The ball itself looks like a large black 8-ball used in the game of billiards, except that this ball is larger and is filled with a dark liquid that gives cover to its contents: A small three-dimensional triangle that has phrases on each face such as “Signs Point to Yes,” “Don’t Count on It,” “You May Rely on It”, “Yes,” or “Definitely.”

The person holding the 8-ball gets to ask a question, shake the ball and then wait breathlessly for the answer to appear. Of course, if you were like me and the answer wasn’t one you liked, you would shake the ball again until a better answer appeared.

Some people mistakenly approach the Bible this way. They have a question, open the Bible, point their finger on a verse and claim that as an answer from God, that is, as long if they like the answer. The problem is, the Bible isn’t a Magic 8-Ball nor is God a “Genie in a Bottle” that seeks to serve us and grant our wishes. The Bible is an amazing collection of God-inspired letters, writings, poems, songs, history, prophecy, judgment and more. It was written over hundreds of years by over forty different authors ranging in profession from king to shepherd, fisherman and recovering Pharisee. It is God’s love letter to the world.

The Apostle Paul wrote of the comprehensive nature of the sacred Scriptures stating, *“All scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man or woman of God may be competent, equipped for every good work”* (2 Timothy 3:16)
