



Hollow Worship

Ever wonder how many people go to church and worship each week but then leave the church and live in sin the rest of the time?

It happens more times that any Christian would care to admit. Professing believers living a counterfeit faith life, only going to church to put on a show and go through the motions. I refer to this as hollow worship because there is no real internal dedication or devotion to the Lord, only an artificial outward shell.

When we look at the words of the prophet Amos we, find the problem of hollow worship is not just a modern day issue; it happened back in Old Testament times as well with the Israelites. Look at this passage:

“Go to Bethel and sin; go to Gilgal and sin yet more. Bring your sacrifices every morning, your tithes every three years. Burn leavened bread as a thank offering and brag about your freewill offerings—boast about them, you Israelites, for this is what you love to do,” declares the Sovereign Lord.
Amos 4:4-5

God’s word tells us that the Israelites were going through their worship obligations. They were bringing their sacrifices and tithes, bragging about their spiritual goodwill toward God. The scriptures tell us they loved to boast about all they were giving to God but something important was missing. You see, God didn’t covet their material sacrifices as much as He did their internal ones. He wanted them to give Him their hearts.

Friends, God doesn’t want us to just put on a show when it comes to worship. He wants us to give Him our all just as He gives His all to us. He just doesn’t want some of our devotion He wants all of it. And He doesn’t just want a portion of our commitment, He wants us to be all in when it comes to serving Him.

In the end translation, God doesn’t want us to act like we are set apart from sin when we aren’t. He can see through any front we try and put up so why do we even try in the first place. We may fool others but we will never fool the Lord. Ever.

Today and every day, let us all make sure we fully give all our honor, glory, and praise to the only One who can lead us to righteousness, the only One who can lead us away from the sin, the only One who can redeem and save us.

Let us worship our Lord with all our heart and mind and soul and strength, every second of every minute or every hour or every day.

Silver and Gold Cannot Satisfy



“They will fling their silver into the streets and their gold will become an abhorrent thing; their silver and their gold will not be able to deliver them in the day of the wrath of the Lord. They cannot satisfy their appetite nor can they fill their stomachs, for their iniquity has become an occasion of stumbling.” Ezekiel 7:19

Ezekiel described a time when disaster would come against Israel. But they were not prepared. And it was too late to act.

They might have trusted in their own resources and abilities. But these disasters revealed how these things suddenly seemed meaningless and unimportant. They mattered so little that they would “fling their silver into the streets.” Even their gold would become “abhorrent.” Instead of being treasured, “their silver and their gold will not be able to deliver them.”

Their armies and weapons couldn’t save them. Their riches and connections weren’t enough. None of these things could “satisfy their appetite” or “fill their stomachs.” Instead, their sin and iniquity had become so dominant that it had “become an occasion of stumbling.”

How easy it can be for any of us to have the same expectations. To depend on armies and resources. Our skills and abilities. The things of this world. However, the only thing that really matters is our relationship with God.

The Bible teaches us to realize the importance of understanding His perspective on our lives. We can’t store up enough earthly treasures. Here, *“moth and rust destroy”* and *“thieves break in and steal.”*

Instead, we are to store up treasures in Heaven. To invest in God’s Kingdom. For *“where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.”* Each gift we give and seed we plant bears the promise of a harvest.

Instead of depending on the things of this world, we are to *“seek first His kingdom,”* confident that *“all these things will be added to you”* (Matthew 6:19-33).

Today, make sure that you have the right priorities. Trusting in God. Seeking first His Kingdom. Support your church. Be confident in your relationship with Him.

Make this your prayer today:

Father, fill me with Your Spirit. Give me joy and peace. Thank You that I can trust in You. Thank you that I can help build your Kingdom by supporting the work of HBC! - In Jesus’ name. Amen.



How to Get Over Your Past

All of us have chapters we wish we could rewrite. To get over your past you must first start looking at it differently.

Reframe it. Ask, "How did it make me stronger? What do I know now that I didn't know then?" Don't focus on what you lost, but on what you gained.

Second, understand the difference between guilt and shame. Guilt is feeling bad about what you've done – it's healthy; shame is feeling bad about whom you are – it's toxic and debilitating.

All of us have things we'd like to change about ourselves, but when God created us He said, "...it was very good..." (Gen 1:31), so start seeing yourself as He sees you.

Third, stop punishing yourself with the "if only's." After stumbling badly and having God pick him up, David wrote, "Happy is the person whose sins are forgiven... whom the Lord does not consider guilty..." (Ps 32:1-2) Forgive yourself; God has. Because He sees you through the Cross, you are "accepted" (Eph 1:6).

Finally, move from pain to gain. Healing takes time, so expect some anger, fear and sadness. Don't disown them; they're part of the process.

But don't adopt them either; know when it's time to move on. You can't walk backwards into the future, and the future God has in mind contains more happiness than any past you can remember.

The reality is that the hope of the world is the message of Jesus through the local church. *And you have a place in that!* You are invited to be a part of the greatest movement in the history of the world.


