





4. Birds provide a pattern of turning to walk with God. (ex migration)


Our May Meeting

Is It Wednesday Of Your Holy Week?...

The Bible doesn't record any activity for Wednesday during Jesus' final week. It is silent. We can assume a lot of things, but the truth is that we don't know what went on. I think it was the calm before the storm. It was that moment of silence before it all broke loose. Most likely he spent the day quietly preparing for the Passover since it was going to begin shortly. He knew what was coming even though the others didn't.

I recently watched an interview with Jesse Martin who was the youngest person to sail around the world solo and unassisted. He was 17 years old when he set sail. During the interview, they showed some footage from the documentary "Lionheart" that was made from his trip. In one of those clips, he looks at the camera and says, "Something's wrong. It's too quiet. I've been watching the barometer and it just keeps falling. It's eerily quiet out here. I'm going to prepare the boat for the worst and get ready for anything." His instincts were right and his preparations weren't in vain.

A bad storm came that night and flipped his tiny ship on its side several times. Winds reached 80 miles per hour, the boat was damaged, he lost a couple of things too, but he survived. When asked about how that affected him, he said, "The day after the storm was over was one of my happiest days. I knew that I had survived and was going to make it." He survived because he prepared appropriately.

Jesus knew that this was His final week. The barometer was falling and there was a sense that something was wrong. This week was all about Jesus preparing for the storm that was coming.

Even though Jesus knew it was coming, His flesh was still very much alive and active. On Wednesday, I believe He was finished getting ready for the storm and just spent time with His disciples savoring every moment. He was all about relationships and He knew what Thursday evening would bring.

If you're in that moment before a storm in your life, make preparations now. If you feel a storm brewing and it's eerily calm, trust in God to get you through. The storm is on His radar and He's given you insight so that you can prepare. If you aren't sure how to prepare, spend time in prayer.

Read and study about Jesus' last week and put God's Word in you. It will act as an anchor to hold you through the storm. You may get knocked over, the winds may beat against you, and you might even sustain some damage. Storms don't last forever though. You will emerge stronger and happier because you will know that through Him, you can survive anything.

Drawn Closer to God This Week...

This is the week we reflect upon the depth Jesus' passion and love for us. More than at any other time we feel His divinity resonate with our humanity. As we read familiar Scriptures, we identify with Jesus' followers as they fall asleep, betray, deny, flee, despair, and generally fail to "get it". We imagine what it was like for them to watch their king, their savior, be arrested, whipped, humiliated, stripped naked, crowned with thorns, and hammered to a wooden cross.

It is a week our souls find a strange comfort in God's intentional confusion and chaos. We know the story from this side of the cross so well. The "Messiah King" is killed by the Romans when the Jews thought He was supposed to be conquering them. Instead of taking the throne, He was nailed to a tree, and forever cursed by it, or so it was thought.

Consider for a moment that Jesus doesn't gaze down at you from some great throne in Heaven. No. He is right there with you, around you and beneath you, waiting for you to let go and fall back into his arms. Jesus has experienced the limits of life's deepest hurt and suffering and He is able to meet you where you are.

There is no depth of despair to which we can ever descend that is lower than Jesus went when he died under the weight of a world full of evil. He drew close to us, and then drew us close in Him. That's God's plan, plain and simple. No matter how low we have fallen, or how broken we may have become, if we are find ourselves drawn closer into Jesus during this week of passion, we will ascend with Him on Easter day.





“And They Crucified Him...”

A medical doctor provides a physical description:

The cross is placed on the ground and the exhausted man is quickly thrown backwards with his shoulders against the wood. The legionnaire feels for the depression at the front of the wrist. He drives a heavy, square wrought-iron nail through the wrist deep into the wood. Quickly he moves to the other side

and repeats the action, being careful not to pull the arms too tightly, but to allow some flex and movement.

The cross is then lifted into place. The left foot is pressed backward against the right foot, and with both feet extended, toes down, a nail is driven through the arch of each, leaving the knees flexed. The victim is now crucified.

As he slowly sags down with more weight on the nails in the wrists, excruciating fiery pain shoots along the fingers and up the arms to explode in the brain — the nails in the wrists are putting pressure on the median nerves. As he pushes himself upward to avoid this stretching torment, he places the full weight on the nail through his feet. Again he feels the searing agony of the nail tearing through the nerves between the bones of his feet.

As the arms fatigue, cramps sweep through his muscles, knotting them deep relentless, and throbbing pain. With these cramps comes the inability to push himself upward to breathe. Air can be drawn into the lungs but not exhaled. He fights to raise himself in order to get even one small breath.

Finally, carbon dioxide builds up in the lungs and in the blood stream, and the cramps partially subsided. Spasmodically, he is able to push himself upward to exhale and bring in life-giving oxygen.

Hours of limitless pain, cycles of twisting, joint-renting cramps, intermittent partial asphyxiation, searing pain as tissue is torn from his lacerated back as he moves up and down against rough timber. Then another agony begins: a deep, crushing pain deep in the chest as the pericardium slowly fills with serum and begins to compress the heart.

It is now almost over. The loss of tissue fluids has reached a critical level. The compressed heart is struggling to pump heavy, thick, sluggish blood into the tissues. The tortured lungs are making frantic effort to gasp in small gulps of air. He can feel the chill of death creeping through his tissues.

Finally, he allows his body to die. All this the Bible records with the simple words, *“and they crucified Him”* (Mark 15:24).
