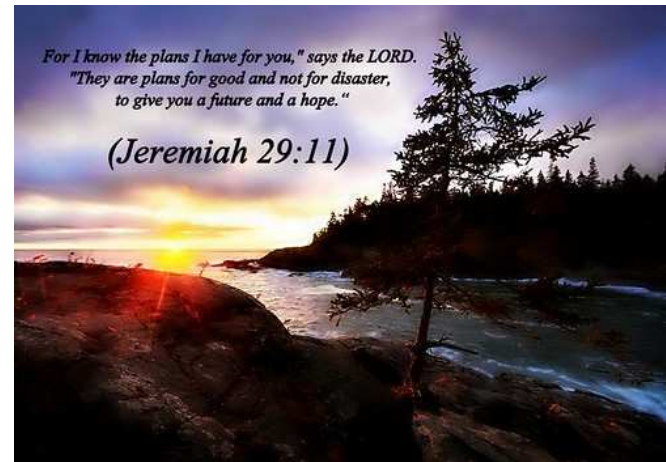
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Jesus Never Said...

“You Won’t Have Bad Days!”

Let’s face it... We all have bad days! One of the most difficult challenges of the Christian life is the fact that becoming Christ followers does not make us immune to life’s trials and tribulations. Why would a good and loving God allow us to go through such things as the death of a child, disease and injury to ourselves and our loved ones, financial hardships, worry and fear? Surely, if He loved us, He would take all these things away from us. After all,

doesn’t loving us mean He wants our lives to be easy and comfortable?

Well, no, it doesn’t. The Bible clearly teaches that God loves those who are His children, and He *“works all things together for good”* (Romans 8:28). So that must mean that the trials and tribulations He allows in our lives are part of the working together of all things for good. Therefore, for the believer, all trials and tribulations ultimately have a divine purpose.

As in all things, God’s ultimate purpose for us is to grow more and more into the image of His Son (Romans 8:29). This is the goal of the Christian, and everything in life, including the trials and tribulations, is designed to enable us to reach that goal. This is explained in 1 Peter 1:6-7: *“In this you greatly rejoice, even though now for a little while, if necessary, you have been distressed by various trials, that the proof of your faith, being more precious than gold which perishes, even though tested by fire, may be found to result in praise and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ.”*

Trials develop godly character, and that enables us to *“rejoice in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope. And hope does not disappoint us...”* (Romans 5:3-4).

However, we must be careful never to make excuses for our “trials and tribulations” if they are a result of our own wrongdoing. God forgives our sins because the eternal punishment for them has been paid by Christ’s sacrifice on the cross. However, we still suffer the natural consequences in this life for our sins and bad choices. But God uses even those sufferings to mold and shape us for His purposes and our ultimate good.

Trials and tribulations come with both a purpose and a reward. *“Consider it all joy, my brethren, when you encounter various trials, knowing that the testing of your faith produces endurance. And let endurance have its perfect result, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing. . . . Blessed is the man who perseveres under trial; for once he has been approved, he will receive the crown of life, which the Lord has promised to those who love Him”* (James 1:2-4,12).

When Trouble Comes Knockin’



Trouble comes in all forms - family problems, financial problems, emotional stress or personal illness, just to name a few. Sometimes it seems like an onslaught of bad situations and other times it is little things that happen every now and then. Troubles are what we call them, but God calls them trials and testings.

May I pass on some good news? God is not sitting in the heavens saying, “How can I send chaos on My children today?” No way! He is the One who will make a way of escape. He is our Deliverer and our Rescuer.

The mind can mentally assess the difficulties and sort them out, but the heart can’t cope. I heard a pastor say in a sermon recently, “It is hard to wrap your heart around trouble when it pierces your soul.” What a profound statement! It is one of those statements you want to tape to a mirror or to your refrigerator. I know I want it to get down into my spirit.

We are not to cope with our troubles; we are to give them to God. St. Paul instructs: *“... casting the whole of your care [all your anxieties, all your worries, all your concerns, once and for all] on Him, for He cares for you affectionately and cares about you watchfully”* (1 Peter 5:6-7, Amplified).

If you cope, you hang on to it. If you give it to God, you can let it go. This is why Paul tells us to: *“Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you.”* The comfort of simply knowing He cares is what we need most. Once we are comforted and pass through our problems, we will be able to help others. Next time trouble knocks at your door, send Jesus to answer it!

"Who Do You Say I Am?"

"A man who was merely a man and said the sort of things Jesus said would not be a great moral teacher...You can shut him up for a fool, you can spit at him and kill him as a demon or you can fall at his feet and call him Lord and God, but let us not come with any nonsense about his being a great human teacher." – C. S. Lewis



Jesus is with His disciples in a place called Caesarea, Philippi. He turns to His disciples and asks them, "Who do people say that I am?" "John the Baptist", "Elijah", "Jeremiah", "one of the prophets." The answers pop forth like kernels of popcorn heating over a stove. Then Jesus makes the question personal, "Who do you say that I am?" It is no longer about what other people think; now it is personal. Every man must decide for himself.

Every man, not only present then with Jesus, but everyman who has ever lived on earth must also decide for himself. In fact, THIS IS the most important question anyone will ever face: "who do you think Jesus is?"

Peter's response to Jesus' personal inquiry was quick and unhesitating (v.16): "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God!" "Christ" as used in those days was the Greek form of the Hebrew word, "Messiah." "Son of the living God" implies a nature superior to that of human; it implies deity, God. Peter throws in an interesting adjective when he says, living God. Jesus is not a dead god like idols worshiped in Caesarea, Philippi; rather Peter states that Jesus is the living God, the real God, the God Who Is.

How does Jesus respond? Note that Jesus does not rebuke Peter and say, "I am not God; I am merely a prophet." Rather, Jesus receives Peter's statement and even blesses him for his proclamation. At the end of His earthly ministry, the Jewish high priest asks Jesus point blank, "Are you the Christ, the Son of the Living God?" Again, Jesus does not flinch; rather, He boldly affirms His own status as Messiah, His own title as Son of God, His own deity, even though it will result in His crucifixion.

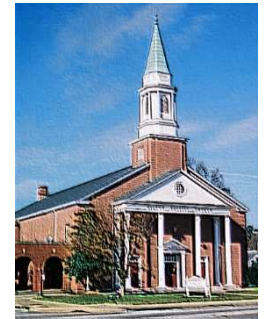
In today's terms, we need to "man-up" to the truth! Jesus was so much more than just a good teacher or a religious prophet. Jesus IS God in a human body, the 2nd person of the Godhead.

As C.S. Lewis framed it, Jesus is either, 'Lord, a liar or a lunatic.' Personally, I believe He proved Himself as Lord by rising from the dead. We must either accept Jesus on His terms as God or we must reject Jesus completely. One option leads to the forgiveness of sins, friendship with God and eternal life; the other option leads to eternal separation from God.
