

Jesus Is Lord!"

In the New Testament, *Lord* is the most frequently used title for Jesus [Christ](#). Although we rarely use this term in our daily lives, we are all quite familiar with another word: boss. That is basically what *Lord* means—one possessing authority, power, and control. The Word of God describes Jesus as the head of the church, the ruler over all creation, and the Lord of lords and King of kings ([Col. 1:15-18](#); [Rev. 3:14](#), 17:14).

Following the resurrection, the term “Lord,” being applied to Jesus, became more than an indication of devotion or respect. Stating, “Jesus is Lord,” became a way of recognizing Jesus’ divine standing.

References of Jesus as Lord started with Thomas’ declaration when Jesus arrived at the apostles after His resurrection: “Thomas said to him, ‘My Lord and my God!’” ([John 20:28](#)). From thereafter, the message of the Apostles was that Jesus is Lord, signifying that “Jesus is God.”

Peter’s sermon on the Day of Pentecost carried that idea: “Let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Messiah” ([Acts 2:36](#)). Peter later declared this in the house of Cornelius, stating that Jesus is “Lord of all” ([Acts 10:36](#)). It is important to note that in [Romans 10:9](#) Jesus’ lordship is connected to His resurrection: “If you declare with your mouth, ‘Jesus is Lord,’ and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.”

The declaration “Jesus is Lord” indicates that Jesus is God. Jesus holds “all authority in heaven and on earth” ([Matthew 28:18](#)). He is “Lord of the Sabbath” ([Luke 6:5](#)); “our only Sovereign and Lord” ([Jude 1:4](#)); and “the Lord of lords” ([Revelation 17:14](#)).

In other words, the realm of Christ’s reign covers everything that happens in heaven and on the earth. No one—not even those who deny His existence—are free of His rule or outside His sphere of authority. Although Satan tries to convince us that liberty is found in doing what we want, true freedom is acquired only through submission to Christ’s loving lordship.

Even death cannot release anyone from the authority of God’s Son. He is Lord of both the living and the dead. All people must decide to either yield or rebel against Him, but they have the opportunity to make this choice only while they are still living. After death, they will acknowledge Christ’s lordship through accountability to Him. If we have not bowed the knee to Jesus in life, we will be forced to bend it in the judgment.

Have you submitted to Christ’s rule over your life? Have surrendered to His authority in knowing Him as the Lord of your life?

The experts say it takes twenty-one days to form a habit. After reading this, you may think, “Just 21 days of waking up early to read my Bible and then it will be easy!” Many others have thought that way too, but it doesn’t work like that.




Spiritual self-discipline isn’t a pursuit that we simply force into habit; for if that were the case, there would be little need for the Holy Spirit in our lives. Remember Galatians 5 then, self-control is a [fruit of the Spirit](#). We wouldn’t have it without the Spirit as it His gifting and work in us. This realization begs the question then: How do we become more self-disciplined in our spiritual lives?

In order to become self disciplined, we need to stop trying to take on the Spirit’s role as the source of life-changing power and rely on the strength He will faithfully work in us. Paul told Timothy to be strengthened by the Grace of Jesus ([2 Timothy 2:1](#)). If our motivation isn’t coming from the Holy Spirit, then we will continue in vain and fail in the practice of self-discipline.

Our motivation will be of an eternal scope when we press into the Holy Spirit, and He will give us the strength to “run with endurance [the race](#) that is set before us” ([Hebrews 12:1](#)).

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to motivate and sustain you in the practice of self-discipline!

Setting Our Priorities

What is at about human nature that makes us looms? So often we coast in our relationships until they skid into a crisis. We think nothing of spending thousands on a car and blindly drive it by the homeless shelter every day. We think nothing of a sixty-hour workweek but can't find time for dinner as a family.

We live lives of loneliness and sorrow because those things that could build our friendships, family, and faith get our leftover time. Then,

one day it is too late, we have waited too long.

We are like the Rabbi who did not run to Jesus until the crisis hit and his daughter was "at the point of death." The Greek word here for this moment of "final desperation."

Take a moment to examine your life today. What is at the "eschatos" – the point of death – in your life right now? What part of your spiritual or relational life is barely breathing?


Find ways to make those areas (family, friendships and faith) a higher priority than career and income. Do something different this week – Intentionally set apart regular time with God, schedule an appointment with those in your own family. Then, after prioritizing God and your family, then set up the rest of the week.

The Last Impression

One day God was walking through the Garden of Eden. After a short while, he came across Adam. Adam was in low spirits this particular day, and God asked him what was wrong. Adam told the Lord that he was lonely.

God responded that He would create Adam a companion. She would walk by his side for all eternity. She would listen to his problems. She would wash his clothes. She would keep his house clean. She would cook his meals. She would do anything to keep him happy. Most importantly, she would never complain or nag him.

To this Adam was ecstatic. His spirits lifted immediately. The Lord hated to tell him that this creature would come at a price. God told Adam that the creature would cost him an arm and a leg.
