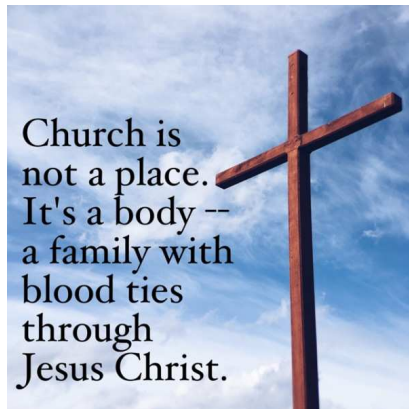
Please read about the HBC Dumpster

The Church's Response To Racial Division

It has been said that ten o'clock on Sunday morning is one of the most segregated hours in American society. Certainly, we in the Church must recognize that we have not done as well as we should in eradicating racism from our midst. I fear that we have sometimes preached the Gospel while closing our eyes to the racism that it condemns.

I believe that our Church must be a witness to the world around us by demonstrating our appreciation of diversity, the welcoming nature of our HBC family, and the firm commitment that we have to fight racism in all its forms. Our church must become an institution that is seen by people of color as a place where their concerns are heard and as a partner in their struggles to achieve racial justice.

An important first step is to recognize and welcome the contributions of all races and cultures. All of us have much to gain from the rich cultural, social, and economic contributions that are being made by people of diverse cultures and ethnic traditions.

In the coming months, it is my hope that HBC will take specific steps to establish a process whereby our members can meet and discuss issues of race and cultural diversity. Through such a process they can share their own experiences, learn from others, and develop specific strategies to help us become more sensitive to issues of race and culture and more active in combating institutionalized racism.

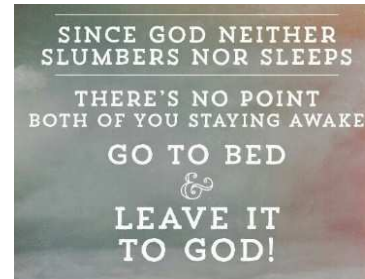
The extreme disparities between the social and economic realities for whites and people of color pose a moral obligation for all of us. These disparities inhibit the common good. Therefore, joining ourselves together as one and working to undo these inequalities is both the right thing to do and the smart thing to do.

Institutionally the Church also has an important public role in working against the evil of racism. Individually, as your pastor, I am committed to using my teaching and preaching to speak out publicly against racism and to promote a deeper recognition of the immense contributions that communities of color are making to our society and our church.

Why? Because I believe firmly that this is God's call upon my life and upon our church. I believe we have come into the Kingdom *"for such a time as this."* Both our past and our destiny meet in this moment now, and how we choose to respond will reveal both our heart and the degree to which we are called to be fully devoted followers of Christ!

Jesus both said and lived out this truth, *"Greater love has no man than to lay down one's life for his friends."* John 15:10. Let us to the same!

Peaceful Sleep

"Answer me when I call to you ... In peace I will lie down and sleep, for you alone, Lord, make me dwell in safety." Psalm 4:1, 8

responded with a simple prayer, wanting to be sure that God heard when he called.

Many men and women have had similar experiences and have gone through many dark nights without rest. These are times to remember lessons learned by David. As David eventually realized, we always can be confident that God hears our prayers. Talking with Him, we can be completely honest. We need to persevere in our prayers and actions and always continue to do the right thing as we trust in Him.

David was reminded that "the Lord has set apart the faithful for Himself." His circumstances didn't change immediately, but he knew that "the Lord will hear when I call to Him" (v. 3).

During those dark nights when he was troubled, David was to reflect and be still. He could look back and realize the many ways God had blessed him: "You have put gladness in my heart, more than when their grain and new wine abound" (v. 7 NASB).

Trusting in God, he found peace – the peace God promises to all who call on Him. It might not seem that He hears us, but we can be confident in Him. He is with us. We can trust in Him.
