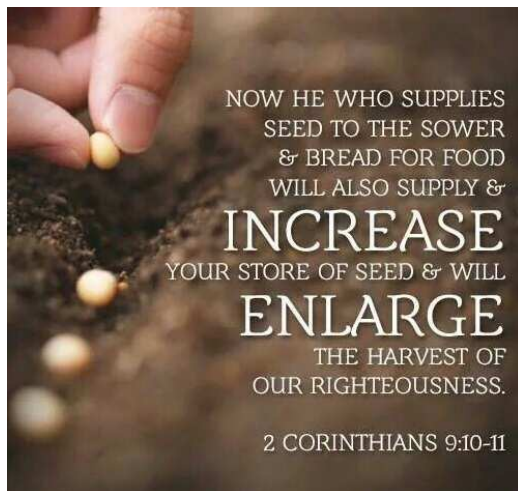

Be Encouraged!

In times like these it is easy to get fearful, saddened, and depressed. Every person you know needs to be encouraged at one point or another. Everyone needs to have someone in their lives who is willing to listen to their stories and tell them they are loved.

I can remember some of the most tender moments with my mother. We would just sit at her dinner table and talk. She would tell me what she was thinking—usually about her time with my father or other special memories from her past. I would listen to her intently, as if I were hearing her stories for the first time. I knew it meant a great deal to her.

But then came one of the most painful days in both our lives. My mother had a devastating stroke. She was paralyzed and could no longer speak. From then on, she couldn't say anything to me—not a word.

Although it was extremely difficult to bear, I was thankful we'd not wasted the opportunities God had given us to express our love for one another. It gave me comfort to know we had not taken those times for granted. I was certain my mother understood how very much I cared for her.

Experiences such as these serve to remind us all: Make the most of the opportunities God gives you to love and encourage others.

Galatians 6:10 teaches, *“While we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, and especially to those who are of the household of the faith.”*

Today is the only certain day we have, especially with those we love. The past is gone and can never be relived. And there are no guarantees of tomorrows. Today is our gift that we must treasure above all. *“Carpe Deum,”* “seize the day,” this very moment to be an encouragement to that someone you love.

One of my favorite instructions from the Apostle Paul reads: *“Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God. 5 For just as we share abundantly in the sufferings of Christ, so also our comfort abounds through Christ”* 2 Corinthians 1:3-5.

Encouragement is like comfort. We give that which we have first been blessed to receive. What about you? Is there someone in your life who needs to know how much you love him or her? Is there someone who would be encourage from your kind words or listening ear? Has the Father impressed upon your heart others to whom you should minister? If so, I encourage you to make the most of the opportunities God gives you.

God And Your Stress

HOW TO GIVE STRESS OVER TO GOD

We live in a stress-filled world, whether you fight the traffic on a busy freeway and bite your nails because you are going to be late for work, or you live in the province and worry about not having enough money to pay for the medicine your child needs to get well. The factors causing stress may be different, but stress is everybody's problem today.

How do we combat it? Do God's children have an inside to coping? Or, perhaps, the better question is, “Should they have means of coping with stress that their non-religious counterpart lacks?”

Research has also demonstrated something which insurance companies should pick up on. Those who believe that God is in control of their lives, and trust Him to do what they can't, live with less stress and have fewer heart attacks.

Question: Who is in control of your life? Yes, I acknowledge that doesn't eliminate the problem you have of coping with a boss who is difficult on a good day and impossible on a medium-to-bad day. But when you take what the New Testament says literally and apply it to your life, it makes a big difference.

Try to begin each day by taking at least 15 minutes to read and meditate on Scripture, perhaps starting with the Psalms, and then commit the needs of your day to the Lord, asking Him to deal with those difficult situations which make for stress in your life.

Learn the power of prayer and what it does, not only for the person for whom you pray but, for you as well. “Prayer Changes Things,” reads the little motto which hung on the wall of many homes I've visited. I understand what that means, but I've come to learn that prayer changes people and people change things.

Knowing that God is your heavenly Father helps you to put life in perspective and realize that 50 years from now, perhaps even 50 days from now, it just won't matter.

Your relationship with God will count even when the stars have burned themselves out and become cinders. Because God loves you and is in control of your life, a lot of what causes stress just isn't worth the cost of worry.

What Real Freedom Means

When Jesus comes into your life He changes you. Whatever you have struggled with in your past, Jesus releases you to triumph and victory in your future.

Maybe you have a problem with drugs or alcohol. Maybe you struggle with lust, fear, doubt, or self-pity. Maybe you're a slave to public opinion or perfectionism.

I want to tell you that the Jesus Christ who set me free is the Jesus Christ who will set you free!

However, our freedom in Jesus Christ isn't the privilege to do what we want. Instead, it is the glorious, abundant, supernatural power to do what we ought. The Bible says that we are now children of God. By His grace, may we live up to our pedigree and faithful to our calling.

It is saving grace that sets us free. It is sustaining grace that keeps us free. Romans 6:22 says, *"that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves to God, the benefit you reap leads to holiness, and the result is eternal life."*

It is completely a gift and power of God's great grace. Bow before the Lord and thank Him for the freedom you've been given through the great love He showed at Calvary!

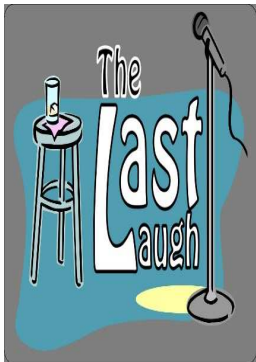

I heard the other day about a man who was a stranger wandering in an upscale neighborhood.

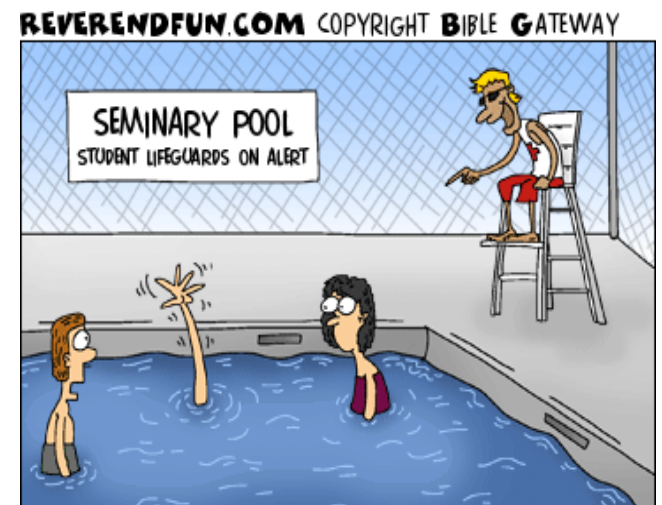
The man approaches one of the houses and knocks on the door and when the owner of the house answers, the man explains that he is homeless and asks him for a meal.
