

When The Devil Knocks, Jesus Doesn't Mind Answering The Door!

I recently heard a powerful thought and saying: *“When Satan knocks at the door, let Jesus answer it.”*

I try to imagine actually being able to do this. Can you imagine if you really could? I mean what if you knew for a fact every time the devil was responsible for the temptation, the trial, the sinful suggestions, the weaknesses of flesh and spirit. The reality would be that you would see the devil coming from miles away and no matter how slick or innocent the approach, you could never be fooled again.

Would you really do as Jesus did in the desert? Would you renounce the promise of riches, fame and power? For you, would it be as easy as *“Away from me Satan!”* *Matthew 4:10.*

According to scripture, after three times, the devil left and the angels came to attend to Jesus and soon thereafter He began to preach. In today's world The real question I'm asking is do you know Jesus well enough to ask Him to answer your front door? When life and the devil deal you a bad hand, can you get the Lord to sit at the table and play it for you? Is your relationship to the Almighty current enough, casual enough, familiar and habitual enough to take His presence in your life for granted? In times of great anxiety, do you need to whisper to God to take over, or are you screaming at the top of your lungs hoping He'll hear your plight?

I don't get the impression that Jesus was screaming at the devil in the desert trying to keep His courage up in the face of temptation. At every turn, it was the devil who was way out of his league because when he came calling, Jesus merely let His father answer the door. *“Man does not live by bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of the Lord ... Do not put the Lord your God to the test ... Worship the Lord your God and serve Him only.”* *Matthew 4:4-11.*

I can only imagine because I'm not there yet (I'm working on it.) what it's like to be able to call upon Jesus so regularly that His presence in my daily life is second nature. I must admit there are times when I recognize that the turmoil in my life has been or is being manufactured by pure evil. That recognition allows me the privilege to simply tell the devil to back up because I don't really have time.

I believe that when your thoughts, focus and energy are truly focused on Him, I truly believe Jesus doesn't mind getting the door!





The Fiery Furnaces Of Our Lives

"Now thanks be unto God, which always causes us to triumph in Christ" (2 Cor. 2:14).

God gets His greatest victories out of apparent defeats. Very often the enemy seems to triumph for a little, and God lets it be so; but then He comes in and upsets all the temporary and deceptive work of the enemy, overthrows the apparent victory, and as the Bible says, *"turns the way of the wicked upside down."* In this way, He gives a great deal larger victory than we would have known if He had not allowed the enemy, seemingly, to triumph in the first place.

The story of the three Hebrew children being cast into the fiery furnace is a familiar one. It looked as if the servants of the living God were going to have a terrible defeat. We have all been in places where it seemed as though we were defeated, and the enemy rejoiced. We can imagine what a complete defeat this looked to be. They fell down into the flames, and their enemies watched them to see them burn up in that awful fire, but were greatly astonished to see them walking around in the fire enjoying themselves. Nebuchadnezzar told them to *"come forth out of the midst of the fire."* Not even a hair was singed, nor was the smell of fire on their garments, *"because there is no other god that can deliver after this sort."*

What appeared to be a hopeless defeat resulted in a marvelous victory!

Suppose that these three men had lost their faith and courage, and had complained, saying, "Why did not God keep us out of the furnace!" They would have been burned, and God would not have been glorified.

If there is a great trial in your life today, do not own it as a defeat, but continue, by faith, to claim the victory through Him who is able to make you more than conqueror, and a glorious victory will soon be apparent. Let us learn that in all the hard places God brings us into, He is making opportunities for us to exercise such faith in Him as will bring about blessed results and greatly glorify His name. –

And the earth shines out the brighter

We must stand in the deepest shadow
To see the clearest light;
And often through wrong's own darkness

Anyway you cut it, a key ingredient in real Christianity is – time. Not left over time, not throw away time, but quality time.


Time for contemplation.

George Bennard was born into a miner’s family in Ohio and came to Christ as a youth. He wanted to go to theological school, but family concerns kept him from the education he desired. In time, he became a traveling evangelist, diligently studying his Bible and reading all the books he could find.

During one period of his ministry, he carefully studied the subject of the cross of Christ, praying for a deeper understanding of its meaning and power. As he preached from town to town, the words of a hymn began formulating in his mind. He sang portions of it at his meetings. The Last Impression


Bob had this problem of getting up late in the morning and was always late for work.

Former British Prime Minister Winston Churchill exemplified integrity and respect in the face of opposition. During his last year in office, he attended an official ceremony. Several rows behind him two gentlemen began whispering. "That's Winston Churchill... they say he is

getting senile... they say he should step aside and leave the running of the nation to more dynamic and capable men."

When the ceremony was over, Churchill turned to the men and said, "Gentlemen, they also say he is deaf!"

The human race is divided into two classes – those who go ahead and do something, and those who sit still and inquire, "Why wasn't it done the other way?" How many times have we left a job, a project, a church, an important relationship because we just didn't find it good enough? Some of us make a lifestyle of it! But God wants us to be the kind of remarkable people who don't criticize, complain and go out looking for something better all the time. He wants us to be a people who determine to make a difference in the lives of the people and situations He allows us to face!

In James 1:22-25 we read, "But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man observing his natural face in a mirror; for he observes himself, goes away, and immediately forgets what kind of man he was. But he who looks into the perfect law of liberty and continues in it, and is not a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work, this one will be blessed in what he does."

Is your job boring and you want a change? Ask the Lord how you might grow in your giftings there. Ask Him to help you come up with a creative solution and maybe even improve your workplace altogether.

Are you dissatisfied with your church because it is lacking in some ministry area you consider vital? Perhaps the Lord is calling you to help start one up! Let's be a doers! Let's be people of vision!

There's much too much to be done for the Lord to be sitting around criticizing. Let's determine to stop being complainers and go forth and do great things for Him!

What is Holding Back Revival in America?

According to a well-known evangelist, here are nine things that are holding back revival in America:



We are guilty of a lack of a devotional life.

We have been guilty of accepting the doctrine of false grace, which has allowed us to believe we can be Christians and go on and live any kind of life we want to.

We have been guilty about not having a sense of urgency and emergency about our message. We no longer preach as dying men to dying men.

We have been guilty of idolatry. The Scripture says that covetousness is idolatry.

We have been guilty of hypocrisy. We have talked farther than we have walked.

We have been guilty of worldliness. TV and various other media devices are now being used to pull down the standards we once held, as evangelicals, on separation from the world. May God help us all!

We have been guilty of Phariseeism, self-righteousness, being "holier-than-thou!"

Controversies rage among us. We have been guilty of name-calling, hair-splitting, jealousies, pride, anger, headiness, gossiping, bickering, and back-biting. We are divided when we should be unified.

These problems, he asserted, could be best answered by "an old-fashioned, heaven-sent, Holy Ghost revival."

Who is the well-known evangelist who shared this?

Billy Graham. When did he say these things? 1953!

What can American Christians do to bring revival? Graham wrote, "Revival in America and the world waits until our wills are subject to His will. When we are willing, God's power will fall on us and the world will see that power in our lives!"



You Want To Be In God's Will...Is He In Yours?

God Word commands us, *“Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust does corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust does corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal: For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also”* (Matt. 6:19-21).

By planning ahead in writing your will and choosing to leave part of your estate to the ongoing work of God's Church, you can continue to fulfill God's purpose even after your death. Sometimes I like to ask, *“You want to be in God's will... Shouldn't He be in yours?”*

Your Last Will and Testament can stand as a final act of good stewardship. Oftentimes a designation of the tithe, or simply one-tenth of your estate will far exceed beyond many tithes and offerings given at their present value. When we specify a portion of our inheritance to God first, we honor not only Him but our family and friends as well.

God Himself has told us that everything belongs to Him: *“The earth is the LORD'S, and the fullness thereof; the world, and they that dwell therein”* (Psa. 24:1). As good stewards, we must seek God's will in deciding what we do with His gifts. We know that God accomplishes His purpose through those who seek to do His will, and that He has *“has put in [our] hearts to fulfill His will”* even after we are gone! (Rev. 17:17).
