

This Sunday we are going to discover a faith-exploding place where the Old and New Testaments come together like nowhere else in scripture. We are going to encounter a fresh revelation from God and uncover a hidden truth about believers being entitled to the Blessings of Abraham, by faith.

"To the end that through [their receiving] Christ Jesus, the blessing [promised] to Abraham might come upon the Gentiles, so that we through faith might [all] receive [the realization of] the promise of the [Holy] Spirit." Galatians 3:14

In this promise and power-filled verse, the Apostle Paul highlights the purpose and significance of receiving Christ Jesus. The blessing that was promised to Abraham is made available to the Gentiles (That includes you and me!) through our faith in Jesus.

This blessing refers to the promise of salvation and the inheritance of eternal life and material prosperity also. By having faith in Christ, both Jews and Gentiles can receive the Holy Spirit, experience the fulfillment of the promise, and receive the blessings of God like never before!

The Blessing Of Abraham Is Yours!

Over the next several weeks, we are going the manifold blessings that Jesus Christ obtained for us when he came and died on the cross for us. We will be exploring principles that are key to claiming all these blessings of both Abraham and Jesus Christ which have been given us when we enter into our full inheritance by faith.

Our key Scripture that speaks about our redemption and deliverance from the curse of the Law is Galatians 3:13-14:

"Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us, for it is written: "Cursed is everyone who is hung on a pole."

He redeemed us in order that the blessing given to Abraham might come to the Gentiles through Christ Jesus, so that by faith we might receive the promise of the Spirit."

When Jesus hung on the cross, He was visibly, demonstrably presented as bearing a curse because in the Old Covenant in the book of Deuteronomy it was written, "Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree." But that same Jesus bore the curse not for Himself, but for us. He was our substitute. The one who took our nature that He might take our place! So, the curses caused by our disobedience came upon Jesus, the positive intention being that in return, through our faith in Him, the blessings due to His obedience could be made available to us.

You have to understand the exchange. Jesus took the curse that you might have the blessing. Jesus took the evil due to us, that you and I might receive the good due to Him. That is the key to understanding the cross and the cross is the key to understanding the whole message of the gospel.

Now, in Galatians 3:14, Paul says:

"...in order that in Christ Jesus the blessing of Abraham might come to the Gentiles."

Elsewhere in the epistle to the Galatians, he explains that through our faith in Jesus, the seed of Abraham, we can be reckoned as the descendants of Abraham, although, for those of us who are Gentiles and non-Jews, we are not the descendants of Abraham by natural descent. Through our faith in Jesus, the promised seed of Abraham, we enter into the inheritance of Abraham, and we become heir to the blessings that God promised to Abraham and to his descendants.

Jesus, through His death on the cross, has made redemption from the curse of the broken law possible for both the Jewish people and for us, who are Gentiles, in the inheritance of Abraham. Through your faith in Christ, God now makes available to you, too, the blessing of Abraham!



<u>The Piecemakers Quilt Guild</u>—This group meets the second Tuesday and Friday of the month. They have been meeting here at the church for many years


<u>The Girl Scouts</u>- For many years, We have been allowing Troup 1430 use a room on the second floor of the church. They meet every other Wednesday.

Have A Heart After God!

New Testament genealogies of Jesus the Christ all identify Him as the son of king David. It was universally understood from the Old Testament that the messiah would be descended from David and that he would restore the Davidic monarchy to its ultimate and most universal expression, even that this king would reign and sit on the throne forever.

Why was Jesus' identification with David so significant? One reason is that David is the only man in the Bible about whom the


Lord said, this is "a man after My own heart".


Yet we know well David's imperfections ... adultery and murder -- so why would God say this about him? I believe it was David's lifelong love for and abandoned worship of the Lord, and also his contrite heart (Ps. 51) and the depth of his sorrow and repentance which showed this relationship to be the most important and precious in his life.

God isn't expecting perfection from us -- His Son has provided that. Jesus alone is the Man whose heart and actions are flawless. But David exemplified a man whose love and respect for his God were constant, if imperfect, a man after God's own heart. This is the heart that God seeks today... contrite, worshipful, and filled with respect and love for our God!

David provides a wonderful example for us who are as imperfect as he was. We may fall and fail miserably – but it's how we get up that makes the difference. Our constant desire to preserve this most precious of all relationships will show that we too have a heart after God. I know I want to hear Him say...

"Yes, you are truly someone after my own heart!"





We Do Not Lose Heart

"We fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal."— 2 Corinthians 4:18

John 9 tells a story about Jesus healing a man who was blind since birth. Jesus mixed his own saliva with some dirt, spread the muddy mixture on the

man's eyes, and told him to go and wash in a pool—and the man received sight. For his entire life, this man had seen nothing but darkness, but Jesus gifted him with seeing eyes after proclaiming, "I am the light of the world" (John 9:5).

The apostle Paul advises God's people not to lose heart when the troubles of this life dim our outlook on the future. When we are discouraged by the sin and injustice of the world, a broken relationship, a tough situation at work, a grim financial outlook, a health crisis, and more, it can feel like we are sitting in a dark room. How will this ever be resolved?

It's all about perspective and what we focus on. We can sit around with mud on our eyes, or we can wash it off and see the light of Jesus. Paul says the problems we see are temporary, but the hope we have in Jesus—though unseen—is eternal.

The body you're sitting in was not created to last forever; mine is not expected to last more than a few years. But as Christians, we share a bright future in Jesus Christ, the light of the world.
